The disciples were shattered. They had believed that Jesus Focuswas the one sent by God to Israel. But they had seen him die. It had all been a big mistake. Their faith in Jesus had been a delusion. They had been let down badly and were preparing to go back to their former way of life, as fishermen, tax-collectors. We too may feel that way at times and wonder is our faith, too, in Jesus a big delusion? We might have no problem in believing that Jesus was a great teacher. We can easily identify with his call to "love one another." But do we really believe that Jesus rose from the dead and is now alive and present to us? It was only through a personal encounter with the risen Jesus that the disciples came to believe. So, too, it is only through a personal relationship with Jesus, a relationship which is nourished by regular prayer, that we can truly believe that Jesus is alive and present to us. Jesus is not an object of belief but the subject of experience. The Easter season challenges us to ask ourselves do we really believe. And the test of our belief is whether, like the disciples after their own personal encounter with Jesus, we go out to continue what Jesus began, namely to serve and not be served, to love "as I have loved you," and thereby grow the Kingdom of God on earth.
