A reading from the Acts of the Apostles When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire: these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. SECOND READING Galatians 5: 16 - 25 A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Galatians

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to selfindulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all selfindulgent passions and desires.

Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.





God is love, three persons bound in love to each other, who have shared that love with us in the expectation that we would share it, in turn, with one another. It is the Holy Spirit, sent by Jesus after his return to the Father, who is always present to us, inspiring us to love each other, to care, to share, and thereby build the Kingdom of God on earth. The Holy Spirit also challenges our consciences when we fail to reach out in love, when we ignore the distress of others because it is inconvenient for us. The Holy Spirit is like the gentle breeze warming our face when we do good, or the howling wind making us feel uncomfortable when we fail. In the doctors and aid workers in Gaza, in parents caring for their children, in people working for those with disabilities, wherever there is love, there the Holy Spirit is present and at work in our world.
