





A triangle is considered the most stable physical shape, used widely in engineering and construction. It also appears in Celtic paleography, most famously as the Trinity Knot in the Book of Kells. The shamrock as metaphor for the Trinity concords with

Biblical symbolism of the number three: Jesus prayed three times in the Garden of Gethsemane, he was placed on the cross at the third hour, three hours of darkness covered the land, and he rose from the dead on the third day.

Today's Gospel contains the Great Commission, where Christ's mission to the Jews is now expanded to include Gentiles: the Good News is proclaimed for all peoples, not just for God's chosen race. This marks a new, bold phase for the disciples in their ministry, and signals the transition in Matthew's Gospel from Jesus as Rabbi to Redeemer of the whole world. In Matthew 1:23, Jesus is named as 'Emmanuel' or 'God-with-us': now, Jesus promises the disciples that he will be with them until the end of time.

The Greek $\check{\epsilon}\theta\nu\eta$, translated as 'all the nations', comes from the root for 'ethnicities,' and asserts the unrestricted, universal nature of mission. It echoes our St Patrick's Day psalm response and requires us, with the life-giving, relational power of the Trinity to reach out to the stranger, the foreigner, those unlike ourselves. We are commissioned to recognise and celebrate God-with-us in all ethnicities, races, and peoples in our multi-cultural Irish society today.



CORPUS CHRISTI: The annual Corpus Christi procession will take place on Saturday evening next 1st June after 7.30pm Mass, commencing outside the Church at 8.15pm approximately and proceeding through the town to the Friary for prayers. Refreshments will be available afterwards. People are invited to collect petals, which First Holy Communion children will scatter during the procession. The petals can be left in the Church porch from Friday morning onwards. The children who received their First Holy Communion last weekend are asked to make a special effort to attend the Mass next Saturday evening, and take part in the procession. Parishioners are also invited to place a small altar outside their homes or business along the route of the procession. Members of our parish who have left their own country and now live locally are invited to carry their national flag during the procession. Anyone interested in this can leave a note with their name & nationality in the Sacristy before next Saturday.

ANNIVERSARY MASS: Next Saturday 1st June, Mass will be celebrated in St. Patrick's Church at 2pm to mark the 25th anniversary of the death of Private Billy Kedian. The Ballyhaunis native was killed, aged just 22, while on peacekeeping duties in Lebanon, having saved the lives of 14 colleagues after they came under fire on 31st May 1999. The town of Ballyhaunis came to a standstill for Billy's funeral, and he was laid to rest with full military honours. A memorial in Billy's honour will be unveiled in July.
