

The bread of life - the Body of Christ - is often called "food for the journey". Each Mass is the occasion of God giving himself to us in Christ as a companion on our journey of life.





Jesus connects with people through table fellowship; it was an extremely important part of his ministry. It is not only the food that is important; Jesus nourished people in a more significant way. The failure of the crowd to grasp this significance is a cause of frustration for Jesus in the gospel today. The crowd, who have

been searching everywhere for him (6:22–24), demand that he give 'bread from heaven'. They seem to want Jesus only for what he can physically give them and have not been touched on a deeper level.

In Laudato Si', Pope Francis challenges all Christians to undergo an ecological conversion and invites us to look at the world from within rather than from without. He notes how, at its root, the ecological crisis is a deeply spiritual crisis. Christianity offers an alternative understanding of the quality of life, it encourages a prophetic lifestyle, but this requires a contemplative lifestyle too, 'one capable of deep enjoyment free of the obsession with consumption. We need to take up an ancient lesson ... that "less is more".' (LS, §222). A constant flow of goods 'baffles the heart'. This constant desire for more exists because ultimately we are not at peace with ourselves. Only God can fill that gap, all else is 'food that perishes'. We are invited to an inner attitude that is happy with less and being spiritually detached from what we possess. This is not a lesser life, it can be liberating, 'a way of living life to the full'. (LS, §222). The people want to know 'What must we do to perform the works of God?' But there is only one thing, be present to Jesus as he is present to you. Out of that, all else will flow. Jesus is the 'Bread of Life', food for the long-haul journey of life, food that truly satisfies. Jane Mellett





NATURE TIP FROM BALLYHAUNIS TIDY TOWNS:

Traditional bedding plants such as Begonia, Petunia & Geranium are not good sources of pollen & nectar for bees and other insects—better sources of food for pollinators include single flowers such as Snapdragon, Vervain, Dianthus, Cosmos, Bacopa & Marigold.
