All Souls Day is a day we meet to remember all who have died, especially during the past year. It is good to remember our dead, and to be grateful for their lives. At our death we bring with us the loves of our life - and so something of ourselves go with them in this link of heaven and earth. While the day is a sad day in many ways, let it be also a day of gratitude for the gift in our lives they have been.


